

Spain Trip June 23rd - July 4th





Day 1: Sunday, June 23, 2019 – Los Angeles to Madrid

Today we travel to Spain! We will start our journey by arriving at the LAX Airport 3 hours before our flight. After crossing the Atlantic, via Newark Airport we will arrive at Europe's third largest city – Madrid. Meals and snacks will be served on our flight.

Day 2: Monday, June 24, 2019 – Madrid

We arrive in Madrid. Clear customs. Met by Culture Path staff. Board busses for hotel. Check-in. Walking tour. Instrument check for cellos & basses. Dinner. Sleep!

Day 3: Tuesday, June 25, 2019 – Madrid

This morning we will visit the Prado museum which is internationally famous, mainly on the account of its enviable collection of paintings. We will continue our sightseeing with a visit to Madrid's Royal Palace (also known as the Palacio Real). It is a beautiful baroque structure with approximately 3,000 rooms, making it one of Europe's largest castles. Lunch. In the afternoon we will be having full rehearsal. In the evening we will be going to a special dinner and Flamenco show!



Day 4: Wednesday, June 26, 2019 – Segovia Performance Day


Today we experience a trip to and performance in Segovia. We will perform in the Palace of Segovia.

Day 5: Thursday, June 27, 2019 – Zaragoza Performance Day

After breakfast we will leave Madrid and journey 3 hrs. to Zaragoza. We will have a chance to have lunch and explore the old town of Zaragoza including a visit to the famous Basilica of our Lady of the Pillar. We will have dinner in the town and then go to our evening performance, at the Iglesia Del Real Seminario de San Carlos de Zaragoza. We will stay in Zaragoza for the night.

Day 6: Friday, June 28, 2019 – Zaragoza to Valencia

After breakfast in Zaragoza we will depart for Valencia. As part of our tour we will have the chance to stop and take some photos of Ciudad de las Artes y las Ciencias, the "City of Arts and Sciences," a newly constructed area of Valencia boasting spectacular architecture. Following our city tour will proceed to our accommodation and check-in. Dinner. Sleep



Day 7: Saturday, June 29, 2019 – Valencia

After breakfast, we will start the day with a city tour in downtown Valencia. We will end in the center of the old town with free time to explore. We will gather at a central meeting point and return to our accommodations for lunch. After lunch we will have a rehearsal/workshop in the nearby town of Lliria with Kai Gleusteen (Concert master of the Orchestra 'del Gran Teatre del Liceu' in Barcelona) at the Teatro Lliria.

After the rehearsal we will go to one of Valencia's popular beaches for a late afternoon dip in the Mediterranean Sea.

Day 8: Sunday, June 30, 2019 – Valencia Performance Day

This day will be a full day of music with rehearsal and a performance. Our performance, with special guest artist Kai Gleusteen, will be at Palau de las Musica de Valencia.



Day 9: Monday, July 1, 2019 – Valencia to Barcelona

After breakfast in Valencia we will begin our journey up the coast to the capital city of the Catalonia region – Barcelona. Our journey up the coast will include a stop in the UNESCO heritage city of Peñiscola where we will have a chance to explore the old city and castle.

Upon arrival in Barcelona we will visit Park Güell and then take a Panoramic tour of the city ending at the Sagrada Familia.

If time allows we will continue our exploration of all things Gaudi with visits to other architecture marvels in the city. After our day of tours, we will check into our hotel, have dinner and take a rest!

Day 10: Tuesday, July 2, 2019 – Barcelona Performance Day

Music Day in Barcelona with rehearsals and a performance, with special guest artist Kai Gleusteen, at Palau de la Música Catalana.

After the concert we will return to the hotel for a celebration of the completion of an amazing Spanish musical experience!



Day 11 – Wednesday, July 3, 2019 – Barcelona

In the morning we depart for Montserrat.

Following our visit to Montserrat we will be bussed back to Barcelona and dropped at Plaza Catalunya. From there we will be taking a walking tour. We will visit the active and popular Ramblas, a wide pedestrian boulevard in the city's heart. Finally, a walk through the Gothic Quarter will take you back centuries. We will have a late dinner in the Gothic Quarter.

Day 12: Thursday, July 4, 2019 – Depart for home

Depart for Barcelona International Airport and our return flight to LA.



Note about daily schedule and meals times

Meal times in Spain differ from those in the USA.

Lunch time is usually between 1:00 pm - 2:00 pm. Dinner time usually starts around 7:30 or 8:00 pm and for the locals often much later!

This changes how the daily schedules are organized. For example, an afternoon activity would start at 2:30 or 3:00 pm and go as late 7:00 pm.



Insurance info

TRAVEL INSURANCE

- Out of Country Travel Medical Insurance is mandatory for all participants.
- Seven Corners can provide medical insurance to those who do not have international travel insurance
- The cost of Out of Country Travel Medical Insurance for people aged 1 to 69 years is \$29 USD per person. It includes:
- > Deductible: \$0
- ➤ Medical Maximum : \$500,000
- > Start Date: June 23, 2019
- ➤ End Date: July 4, 2019

For trip cancellation insurance which includes health insurance, you can contact Seven Corners directly and purchase on your own. This is an individual protection plan for illness and death.

Mandatory Now

- Google Doc info correct and filled out
- Passports valid for at least 3 months after tour
- International Consent forms under the age of 18 not travelling w/both parents
- All 2019 Graduates and Alumni participants MUST complete volunteer waivers
- District Parental Permission, Assumption of Risk & Medical Treatment Authorization
- Final payment due now

- 30 days out you will lose 75% of the trip.



Trip T-Shirt

- No changes are to be made on the shirts. ie: no trimming or cutting etc.


Concert attire needs

- Boys recommended to pack your tux in a half size/Jacket size garment bag. Add your name in Sharpie on bag or on masking tape big and clear
- Make sure your name is inside your jacket and pants as well.
- Bring additional black socks
- Additional bow tie optional
- Pack an additional white tux shirt
- Optional additional jacket
- Mandatory: hang on wire hangers to take less space



Dress Code for entering Churches in Spain

- Spain is a very conservative country and most churches and religious sites have a STRICT dress code. All clothing must be be modest with no bare shoulders and **no "short shorts"** allowed.
- No tank tops, no short skirts, no sandals/flip flops, nothing skimpy. No tights/Yoga pants or leggings. Use good judgment if you'd wear it to the beach you wouldn't wear it here!
 You may be denied access.
- Wear comfy shoes
- Trip T-Shirts may not be altered
- no crop tops, or sleeveless looks

- Small instruments will stay in room

It's free on all platforms - works on Wi-Fi & cell.

No smartphone? Let John know and we will make sure you have a communication buddy from a group or roommate.

Please download ASAP so we can create groups. You will be added to your chaperone group and all orchestra group.

Add Europe on your cell plan for the dates we will be in Spain if you do not already have an international calling plan.

• International plans approx. \$10 a day for many plans.

Additional Notes



Bring spending \$\$ for bathrooms. Some public toilets charge 20 or 50 cents. If you buy something in a café/restaurant you should be able to use the facilities.

Don't keep phone/wallet/passport in back pocket.

You may find it useful to withdraw a small amount of cash at an ATM in Spain – you will pay the lowest conversion rates that way.

Make sure to contact your bank or Credit Card provider BEFORE you travel out of the country.

Additional Notes



Pack your own water bottle. Re-fill constantly

Bring travel laundry soap and wash your own items in room.

Avoid buying souvenirs from street vendors. If you do - use small bills to avoid receiving counterfeit bills as change.

Street vendors will approach you and ask you to buy their items. Say "No Thank You" and keep walking. Ignore them and keep walking if they continue to follow you.

Wear your backpacks on front and not back. Or better yet – don't wear one.
